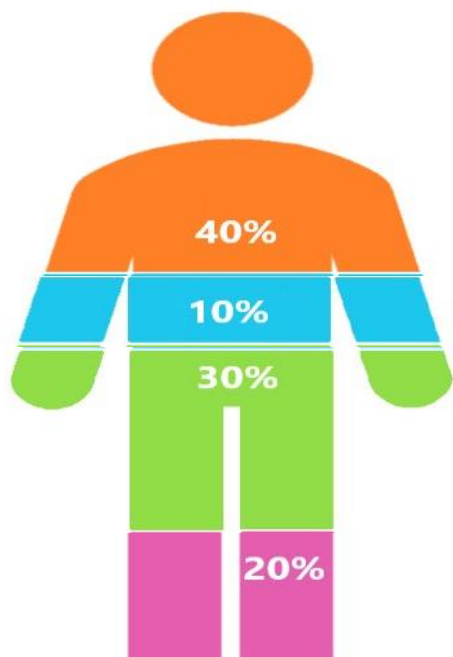

Communities have a sense of wellbeing and feel happy, healthy, connected and safe

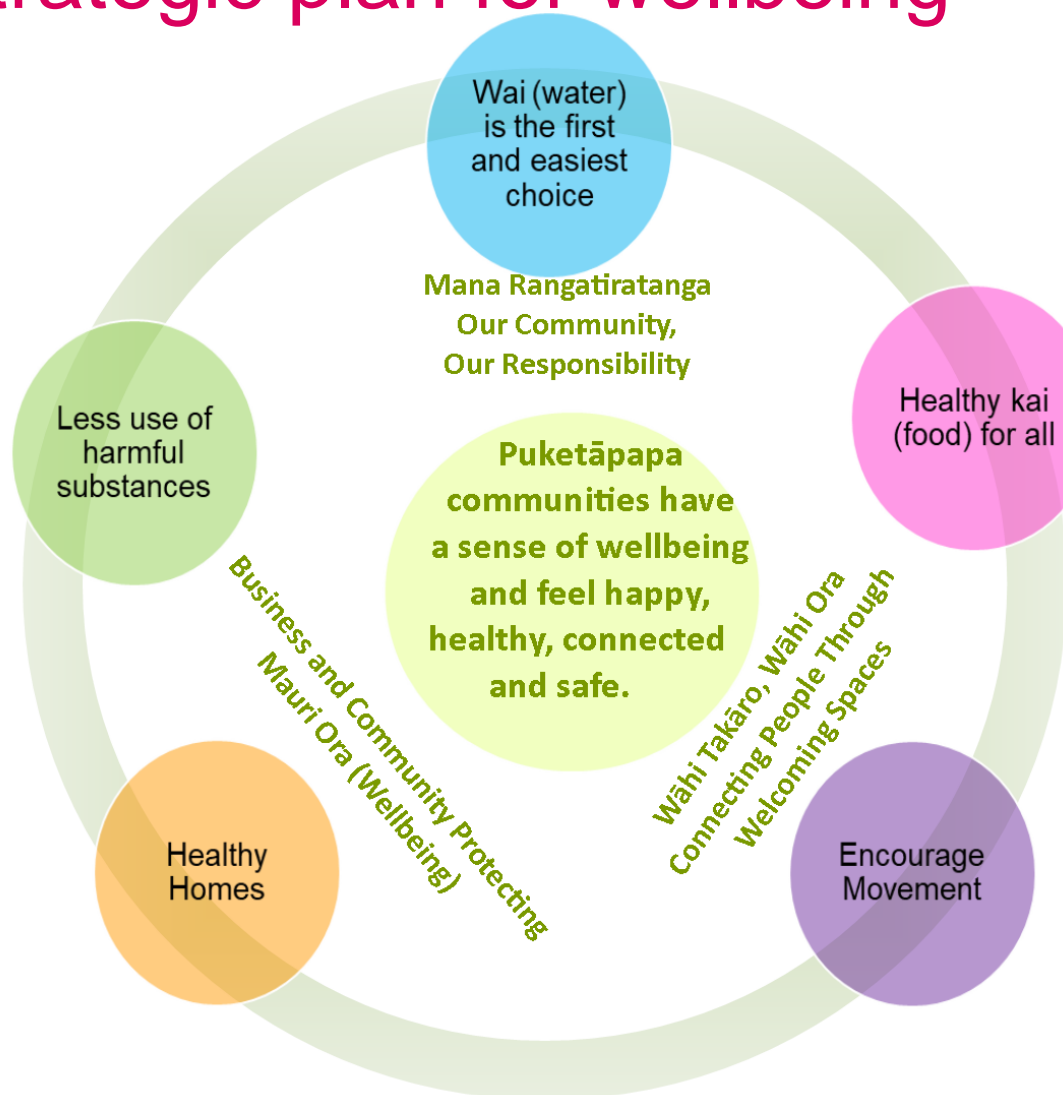
- An umbrella for current work
